Name for Angmering C. of E. New School

Dear Sir,

The old school named Olders is adjacent to the Parish Church of St. Margaret's and its connection to the church is obvious. But the new school is some distance away and moreover has another church (R.C.) with its school in between. The Managers were therefore concerned to name the new school so that its link with the Parish Church (which is financing the school) was very clear.

Though none of Olders Charity capital is invested in the new school, it was desired to perpetuate his memory as its founder. The choice of the Managers and the Parish Church is as follows:-

St. Margaret's School


Founded by William Older, 31st March 1680.

This choice has now been approved appreciatively by Chichester Diocese who share the local financial responsibility.

It is hoped that you will be able to adopt the name of St. Margaret's for the new school without too much inconvenience. Until the last pupil moves into the finished new school two names for the two schools may be in use. Our architect, I notice, solves this by using the title "St. Margaret's (Olders) School", which seems practicable and certainly works in use.

The smaller local problems we feel can well be left to the Headmaster to arrange with the Managers.
